Quarterly Report

DEVELOPMENT

Sia v1.5.7

We released v1.5.7 of **siad** and Sia-UI, featuring scalability fixes for hosts and an updated bootstrap peer list to improve the initial syncing experience. This release also removed all Skynet-related code, further clarifying the distinction between Skynet and the Sia Foundation.

Ledger Apps

Ledger completed their security review of our Nano S and Nano X apps. Both apps are now available in the Ledger App Store.

New core repo

We published a new <u>core</u> repo, an evolution of our work on **sunyata**. This repo contains the building blocks of Sia v2, including core types, consensus code, network protocols, and more. We also began initial work on the hardfork activation code.



OPERATIONS

Budget

We forecasted our expenses over the next year, two years, and four years, arriving at a total budget of \$1.77M for 2022. In light of our goal of holding no more than four years' runway in USD, we can now determine how many coins we can safely burn.

501(c)(3)

We submitted our application for 501(c)(3) status.

Business Insurance

We sourced and secured a D&O insurance policy.

HackMIT Sponsorship



Open positions




While the team did not grow this quarter, we are currently evaluating several strong candidates. Expect to see some new faces next quarter.



FINANCIALS


The Foundation's USD expenses were fairly run-of-the-mill this quarter, dominated by payroll and services. There were no SC expenditures this quarter.

NEXT QUARTER

Continue hiring

Refresh sia.tech

Continue overhauling the website to reflect the Foundation's new role in the ecosystem.

We missed this goal again. Rebranding the main project landing page is not something to be done lightly; we want to get it right, even if it takes longer than we'd hope.

Draft new whitepaper

Write an initial draft of an updated Sia whitepaper that details our new Utreexo-based architecture.

Begin building siad v2

Integrate our new core repo into siad, and write hardfork code to convert existing structures to their v2 equivalents.
